

# Records in Contexts - Conceptual Model

- Records in Contexts Conceptual Model (RiC-CM)
- High-level conceptual model for the definition of archives, records and other related entities,
- It is gradually implemented by archival organisations, along with the corresponding ontology (RiC-O)



**RiC-CM Entities Hierarchy** 


### Corfu Criminal Court Archive (1815-1864)

- 2,698 subfiles with case files


## Subfile/Case Cover

- whether the defendant was under arrest, released on bail or escaped arrest





# First Page of the Indictment

The indictment (Atto di Accusa) was submitted by the Public Prosecutor along with all supporting documents and evidence, to the Criminal Court.








Structure of the Archive




**Modelling Case Process** 



## Conclusion

- The proposed model demonstrates that the Records in Contexts Conceptual Model (RiC-CM) can effectively describe complex historical court archives.
- The data model clarifies how information in a Criminal Court archive can be organised according to RiC-CM principles.
- Applying RiC-CM to the Corfu Criminal Court Archive offers a method for ensuring consistent metadata across various records.

- Preserves the context of each case more accurately
- Makes those records easier to retrieve, compare, and analyse for researchers and archivists.
- Future research could explore RiC-O in line with the proposed RiC-CM data model.
- By examining how these historical archival records can be systematically documented, this research promotes greater accessibility, interoperability, and long-term preservation of important legal and historical data.
